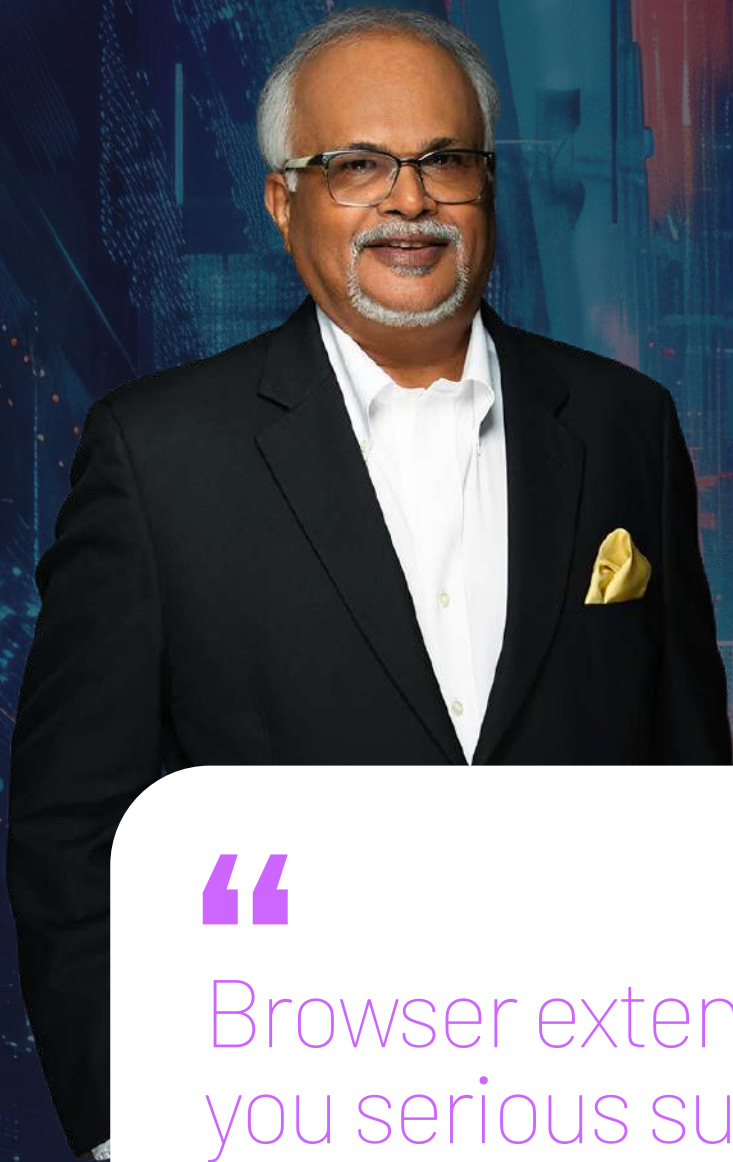

14. Time-Wasters

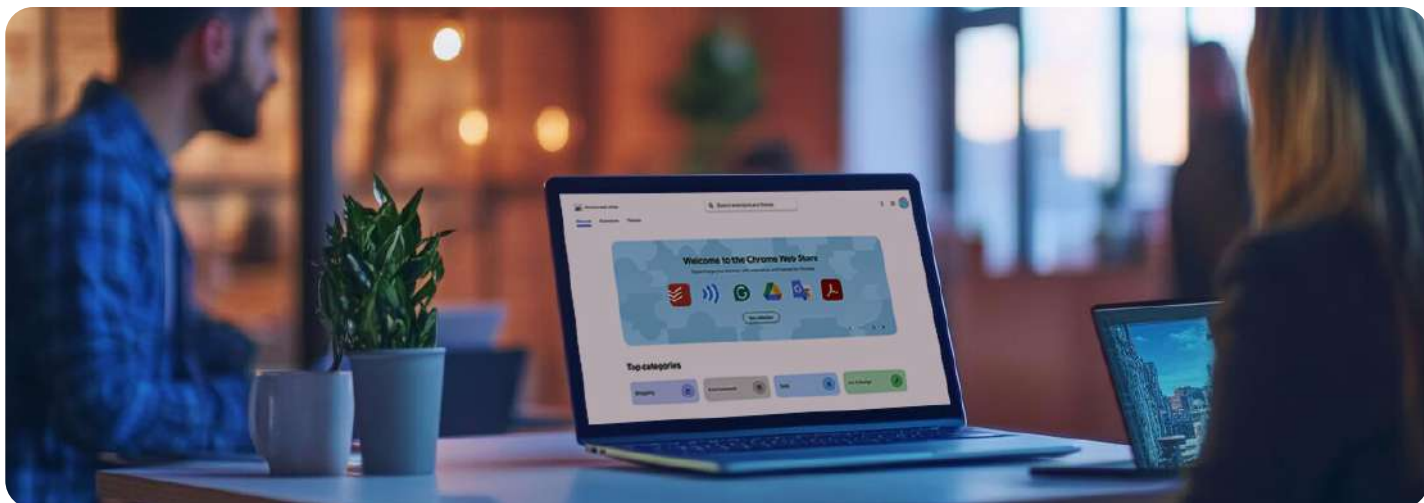
